YABs Fellowship Week Materials & Resources: 19–26 June 2016

As young Anabaptists, we have designated the third week of June for an annual celebration of our common faith and roots in our different cultural contexts by studying a passage from Scripture, sharing songs and prayer requests, hearing each other's stories and praying for each other. We've compiled some materials below to incorporate into your own local context, no matter what time you meet during the week. Our prayer is that they will help draw you into greater community (*koinonia*), not only in your local congregations, but with your international Anabaptist family.



We also encourage you to take the time during that week to reach out to other Anabaptists, Mennonite youth or young adult groups in your area or to reconnect with friends you met during GYS to spend time in fellowship or serve in your community together. Maybe you even want talk about the discussion questions together and spend time praying for each other! We'd love to see how you celebrate YABs Fellowship Week in your community. Please share pictures and videos with us if you can, or even a recap of your discussion.

1. Theme and text: A Cloud of Witnesses: Hebrews 12:1-2

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honour beside God's throne." (NLT)

2. Discussion Questions

- a. What are some things that make you feel connected to a global faith family? To a historical faith family? Do you ever feel disconnected? If so, why?
- b. What are some weights or obstacles (not necessarily sins) that slow you down or keep you from walking in the footsteps of Jesus?
- c. Sin is an ever-present struggle in all of our lives. What are the sins that so easily entangle you as an individual? What about the sins of your church? Of your people? Of your country?
 - Use this time to confess your sins to each other. Consider confessing national/corporate sins to others in your community or other groups/peoples you've wronged as a nation or people group. (1 John 1:9, James 5:16)
- d. Do you sometimes feel that the notion of sin is holding you back, that it makes you afraid to reach out and talk to others about their lives and the things they should/could do better? How can we create an environment where people can be vulnerable and feel like they can share their struggles without being judged? What does it look like to challenge each other and keep each other accountable in our sin struggles?
 - Find someone this week who can hold you accountable with regards to a certain temptation or area of spiritual discipline.

- e. In order to throw off sin, we need to stay focused on our Saviour, Jesus, who became sin for us so that we might live in freedom. What are some practices or ways to cultivate a single-minded focus on Jesus?
 - Share what helps you draw near to him, what grows and challenges you spiritually.
- f. Who are your mentors in the faith (historical, in your local community, and global)? What is it about their faith that encourages and inspires you? What will it take for you to imitate their faith?
 - Take a moment this week to either encourage and thank them in person or through a written note for how they've impacted your walk with Jesus.
- g. All around the world, there are brothers and sisters in faith who are suffering, like Jesus did. Are you willing to go through difficulties and challenges because of your faith in Jesus Christ?
 - Take time to pray for the persecuted church around the world. Refer to the

Africa

Zimbabwe (submitted by Makadunyiswe Ngulube)

- Pray for eradication of corrupt practices within the government.
- Pray for the leaders of Brethren in Christ Church as they lead their congregations.
- Pray for an increase in job opportunities for the young people; may they trust God and not lean on their own understanding.
- Pray for the economic situation in Zimbabwe.
- Pray that the young people may develop a deeper relationship with God and that they will bear fruit in their church, community and nation.
- Pray for boldness to live and die for the Kingdom of Jesus Christ.

Kenya (submitted by Wycliff Ochieng Otieno)

- Pray for an enriching time together at our national youth conference scheduled from 5-12 December 2016, and for good facilitators and enough funds in good time. We pray that the youth will get necessary requirements in good time and be able to participate fully.
- Pray that projects to empower youth to support their own livelihoods would be successful.

- Democratic Republic of Congo (submitted by Felo Gracia)

- Pray for DRC and the political situation in the country. The government has refused to organize elections and there are constant disagreements among the different parties.

Tanzania (submitted by Elisante Daniel Lulu)

- Every three years, Tanzania Mennonite Church (Kanisa la Mennonite Tanzania KMT) does an election process of which this year has started from branches (small churches) then congregations (May and June), diocese level (July and August) and lastly the national leadership (September and October). Election process usually is for all leaders for different groups (example: youths, women, planning and financial, evangelism, relief and support, education and health committees). This is a very important process for our church this year. Please pray for good leaders for KMT who will serve God well.
- KMT has a prayer conference 12–18 September 2016, of which all church members will gather at Arusha Mennonite Church. Please pray that the preparation process to host 600 people for one week will be good and God's glory be seen during the week.

- Burkina Faso (submitted by Samuel Jonathan Philippe Traore)

- Pray for guidance from God concerning the church.
- Some churches have no pastors and we pray that God will raise up leaders that are willing to serve him and to lead his people.

Asia

- India (submitted by Preshit Rao)
 - Pray for those facing persecution to preach God's Word.
 - Pray for our spiritual growth as there are many worldly attractions around us. There is lack of participation in church activities due to jobs and study schedule.
 - According to 2011 census, there are approximately 2.3% Christians in our country, so may God help us to be strong in our faith when we stay with our non-Christian friends.
 - Pray for those facing the problem of unemployment.
 - Pray that God would prepare God-fearing youth leaders for churches. From 22 congregations of Mennonite Churches in India (Mennonite Church Rajnandgaon, Chhattisgarh) only 2 or 3 youths are taking seminary training to serve as pastors.
- Indonesia (submitted by Taning Andari Anita Pudwidaringsih)
 - Please pray for the unity of YABs in Indonesia so that we can work together to share and spread God's love and doing his project for our country (Indonesia) and for the world.

Europe

- Germany (submitted by Benjamin Krauß and Timo Doetsch)
 - Pray for the churches to boldly proclaim God's hospitality for all in word and deed.
 - Pray for political leaders to have wisdom.
 - Pray for the Holy Spirit to speak: "Do not be afraid" to those who march in the streets against refugees. Pray that people may be free of fear and hatred and can open their arms to those who come.
 - Pray for all who work tirelessly to welcome refugees and challenge the spiritual fortress of racism and xenophobia. Pray for churches making a home for refugees, being friends with them and sharing Jesus in word and deed. Pray for the Muslim man from Libya who was impressed by the love of the Christians he encountered in Dresden and wants to rebuild the church in his home city.
 - Praise God for the deep friendships in youth groups. Pray for the meeting of youth groups from the German MB churches in October during the celebrations of German unity. Pray for the preparations and that it will be a blessed time.
- Spain (submitted by Judit Chipirón)
 - Spain had an election campaign in December, but the political parties couldn't get a common agreement, so there is another election campaign this June. May God lead this result and all the politics in general.
 - Christians in Spain are trying to see what we can do with all the refugees and the injustices that are happening. We need his wisdom and love to act.

 - Pray for the students coming to study linguistics this year at PROEL in Madrid with the desire to serve and bring the Word of God to those who have not yet heard.

Latin America

- Mexico (submitted by Ivonne Gorospe)
 - Pray for our youth group, because we have tried to have meetings and activities but that has not been possible due to the following reasons: we are a small church and there is a wide age gap amongst the young people in the group and our interests are different. Most of the young adults work and we have several things to do, and I believe that it is because of this and the lack of interest that nobody is very committed to do something.
 - This coming week we will be choosing a substitute for one of the leaders, we pray that the Lord may guide us.
 - As young people at the conference to which our congregation belongs (there is one located in Toluca and one in which Rodrigo is the pastor) we are starting a youth ministry by designing discipleship workshops and weekly devotionals to be sent to the young people of our conference. May the Lord guide this project, may he give us wisdom and inspiration for

- the development of this activity and that we may also encourage other young people to get involved and to grow in God's word.
